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From Pilots to Practice: Regional Prototypes Move into Implementation (2026)

Following successful design and testing phases, DDI's regional prototypes will transition into full implementation in 2026. This phase prioritises scaling, localisation, and deeper collaboration with regional partners, whose leadership remains central to success.

Each prototype is grounded in the political, digital, economic, and cultural realities of its region and delivered with organisations deeply embedded in local ecosystems.

Implementation will emphasise:

- **Regional ownership and locally led decision-making**
- **Continuous adaptation through real-time learning**
- **Integration of flexible funding and sustainable support models**
- **Long-term ecosystem strengthening and movement building**

Regional Partners and Approaches

Latin America & the Caribbean (LAC)

Led by Wingu, Kubadili, and Civic House, the LAC prototype focuses on strengthening digital civic engagement and collective action.

Middle East & North Africa (MENA)

Delivered by the Innovation for Change MENA Hub, this prototype prioritises digital security, civic space navigation, and advocacy in highly sensitive political contexts.

Implemented by Accountability Lab Pakistan, the South Asia prototype centers on participatory governance, youth engagement, and grassroots-led digital mobilisation.

In partnership with OpenUp, Civic Tech Innovation Network, and Wits University, the SSA prototype prioritises ecosystem building to connect civic tech innovators, data activists, movements, and researchers.

Reach, Benefits, and Impact

By late 2026, prototype implementation will extend beyond the 600+ CSOs supported in 2025, with a strong focus on systems change rather than one-off outputs.

Impact will be tracked across four core areas:

Capacity Strengthening:

Growth in digital, organisational, and advocacy skills

Policy & Systems Influence:

Evidence of civil society shaping reforms and accountability mechanisms

Flexible Funding Access:

Increased resourcing of locally led initiatives

Community Impact:

Improved civic participation, inclusion, and decision-making



Elections & Digital Integrity: Priorities for 2026

As global electoral cycles intensify and online manipulation becomes more sophisticated, DDI's election-focused work in 2026 will prioritise locally led, adaptive responses rather than one-size-fits-all models.

Key Lessons from 2025

- Local partnerships are decisive
- Hybrid online–offline strategies outperform digital-only approaches
- Early intervention prevents disinformation harm
- Digital safety is essential, not optional
- Open and credible data strengthens advocacy

Digital Strategies for 2026

DDI will scale tools to:

- Strengthen verification systems and civic media networks
- Detect disinformation patterns in real time
- Support secure communication and digital safety
- Expand access to credible election data
- Amplify citizen participation through trusted platforms

Digital Resiliency Grants: Strengthening Preparedness

In 2025, **Digital Resiliency Grants** supported **16 CSOs** across East Asia, LAC, MENA, South Asia, and SSA. Grantees strengthened digital security skills, navigated restrictive legal environments, explored tools for operating under surveillance or shutdowns, documented human rights violations, and supported the mental well-being of activists and journalists.

This work lays critical foundations for **safer, more resilient pro-democracy action** in digital spaces. Collaboration with additional organisations will continue in 2026.

Digital Action Lab (DAL): Innovation in Practice

Cohort 1: Completing the Journey

DAL concluded its first cohort with eight partners across Africa, Latin America, the Middle East, South Asia, and EECA—supporting the design, testing, and refinement of locally grounded digital solutions.

Cohort 2: New Solutions Launched

The second cohort brings together ten partners across Brazil, Bolivia, Malawi, Tanzania, Kenya, Nepal, Nigeria, and Ethiopia, advancing experimentation and adaptive learning.

Co-Design in Mombasa

In June 2025, Cohort 2 partners convened in Mombasa for a three-day co-design workshop with technical partner MAKAlA, strengthening collaboration and shared problem-solving.

DAL on the Global Stage

At International Civil Society Week 2025, DAL partner Fundación Niñas de Luz showcased and live-tested their solution, highlighting the global relevance of locally built innovations.

Voices from the Field – DAL Podcast

DAL launched Voices from the Field, a podcast series capturing partners' lived experiences navigating digital transformation, civic space challenges, and applied learning.
