INNOVATION HEATS UP AS HACKATHONS LAUNCH!

The Digital Democracy Initiative officially launched a series of hackathons that will take place in several regions around the world to spark civic innovation and support civil society in co-creating digital solutions that promote inclusive democracy.

Hackathons are already fueling innovation in Latin America & the Caribbean and Sub-Saharan Africa:

LATAM Hackathon

In partnership with <u>Innovation for Change</u>, the LATAM Hackathon was held virtually across five days in March. It brought together 96 participants from 21 countries across Latin America and the Caribbean, with 51% of teams led by youth. Focused on underrepresented communities, participants co-developed 13 civic tech prototypes tackling pressing democracy challenges. Eight winning teams were awarded a US\$3,700 subgrant each to pilot their solutions, supported through three months of mentoring and testing.

The LATAM Hackathon sparked 17 crossorganisational collaborations and 12 strategic alliances.

SSA Hackathon

In partnership with <u>Magamba Network</u>, the Sub-Saharan Africa Digital Democracy Virtual Hackathon accepted applications until 30 April. The virtual hackathon event is set for 9–10 May. Five winning teams will receive a US\$7,500 subgrant each, plus tailored incubation and mentorship support. More information <u>here</u>.

Coordination for the virtual hackathon in the MENA region is also underway. Hackathons in East Asia, South Asia, and Eastern Europe & Central Asia will take place in November, during CIVICUS <u>ICSW</u> 2025 event in Bangkok, Thailand.

Celebrating the 2024 DAL Cohort

Eight organisations selected in 2024 wrapped up their <u>DAL</u> journey, having designed and implemented innovative digital strategies in their local contexts. Stay tuned for our upcoming virtual magazine with details about their projects and impact!

20 Shortlisted for 2025 DAL Cohort

In March, 20 shortlisted organisations, chosen from over 900 applicants, joined the final race to become one of 10 participants in the 2025 DAL cohort. These 10 organisations will receive subgrants to implement impactful digital initiatives to promote inclusive democracy. They will also benefit from group learning opportunities, tailored mentorship and expert-led workshops for the rest of the year.

Later this year, the DAL will celebrate an inperson co-design convening in Kenya, where members from both 2024 and 2025 cohorts will connect, collaborate and co-create.

DIGITAL RESILIENCY GRANTS: STRENGTHENING DEFENSES

DDI's Digital Resiliency Grants continue to empower civil society actors facing civic space and digital threats, from surveillance to online harassment. Grants have supported initiatives such as:

- Enhancing digital security for LGBTQI activists
- Improving organisational resilience for online civic engagement
- Supporting legal and digital literacy for civil society actors
- Offering psychological support for activists
- Establishing digital networks to monitor human rights violations

Peer Learning in Focus

Recognising the need for collective growth, a peer learning group for partners was launched this year. This space enables grant recipients to connect, share lessons and engage in expert-led sessions on topics like digital security, citizen engagement and reporting.
